

Kennel Club Breeders Competition 2009

The following Awards are offered:
Best Breeder in Breed
Best Breeder Group in Group 1st, 2nd,3rd and 4th
Grand Final at Crufts 2010

The following requirements apply to entries for these awards:

- Breeders wishing to enter the competition should first purchase a Breeders Competition Record Book from the Kennel Club or from the show secretary.
- The Breeder enters for the award in his/her name and is responsible for arranging which exhibits form their breeder group, or team
- The Breeder must complete the Record Book accurately with all necessary details before presenting it to the show organisers.
- 4. The Breeder is responsible gaining the necessary authority to compete from the show organisers (or designated official such as the Ring Steward) to compete for the award.
- The Breeder's team should comprise four exhibits of the same breed, all of which must be entered in a class at the show.
- 6. A Breeder may enter more than one team per show.
- 7. All dogs must have the same registered breeder.
- 8. The beaten dog rule will NOT apply.
- 9. Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group award.
- 10. Twenty points are required to qualify for Finals at Crufts in the following year. Points are cumulative over a calendar year and are gained as follows:

Breed win 1 point Fourth in Group 1 point Third in Group 2 points Second in Group 3 points First in Group 4 points

Breeders gaining 20 points should apply to the Canine Activities Department at the Kennel Club to apply for the Crufts Final. After amassing 20 points a breeder cannot enter any further Best Breeder Competitions for that calendar year.

DIRECTIONS TO HUTTON MOOR LEISURE CENTRE:

- Leave the M5 at junction 21, take the 3rd exit onto the A370 (signposted Weston-super-Mare).
- At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A370.
- At airport roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A370 (signposted Weston-super-Mare).
- At Hutton Moor roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A370, Herluin Way (signposted Weston-super-Mare).

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B)

- 1 These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition at a Show. When a dog is found to have been prepared for exhibition at a Show in contravention of these Regulations the exhibitor will be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule 42 had been lodged against them and proved to the satisfaction of the General Committee without prejudice to the right of the exhibitor to make representations to the General committee in mitigation of the penalty to be imposed at the discretion of the General Committee under Rule 42. The dog will be automatically disqualified from exhibition at the Show and from any award gained thereat.
- 2 No substance which alters the natural colour, texture, or body of the coat may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition either before or at the Show. Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing may be done, calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive, except:
- a Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
- b The removal of dew claws of any breed.
- c The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds.
- d Operations to prevent breeding providing that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
- 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. Any objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- 6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

PLEASE NOTE:

Permission must be sought from the Club and/or exhibitors from anyone taking photos and videos at the show.

- 13 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14 No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 15 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex b) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 16 The entrance fee of a dog entered and not exhibited will be forfeited.
- 17 The Committee of the Show can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the Show and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition (K.C.S.R (F)).
- 18 No animal, other than an exhibit duly entered at the Show, will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except by the Special permission of the Committee of the Kennel Club.
- 19 In the event of a judge being prevented from fulfilling his or her engagement the Committee reserve the right to appoint another in his or her place, subject to the terms of the Kennel Club Show Regulation 22 (1). Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition, but fees etc., will be forfeited.
- **20** The Hon. Veterinary Surgeon or Hon. Secretary will be empowered to exclude any dog which in his opinion is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from disease, or any other reason, and if such exclusion takes place, either before or after the dog is judged, entrance fees will be forfeited.
- 21 The Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to a dog or property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever, nor from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants or others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
- 22 Exhibitors must provide drinking bowls and food for their dogs and are responsible for clearing up and removing loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge. This also applies to litter, whether in the car park, exercise area or from any other part of the venue and its precincts. This is now a Kennel Club requirement and offenders may be reported for further disciplinary action. Please consider others and ensure that this venue is kept as clean and tidy as possible and every facility will be provided for cleaning up any dirt left by your dog or yourselves.
- 23 Well behaved children are welcome but please note that parents and guardians will be held fully responsible for their actions, and any damage caused within the environs of the Show.
- 24 Should any question arise not provided for in these regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.
- 25 PRIZES AND TROPHIES: Rosettes and Prize Cards to VHC in every class. Special Rosettes for Best in Show, Reserve Best in Show, Best Dog, Reserve Best Dog, Best Bitch, Reserve Best Bitch, Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show. Trophies for class winners to be listed in the catalogue, to be held from corresponding show to show and are confined to Members only, who will be responsible for their upkeep whilst in their care.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word "Dog" includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the Title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class. i.e. 7th September 2009.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1 WITHDRAWAL The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of regulations 9(j) and 20.
- 2 TRANSFER
- A If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- B For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior class or the Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class, to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- C For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex. weight or height.
- D If an exhibit arrives late or misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog many not be transferred to any other class.

VETERAN - For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

MINOR PUPPY - For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY - For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

JUNIOR - For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

YEARLING - For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the show.

NOVICE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more first prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted), whether restricted or not.

DEBUTANT - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or a first prizes at a Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted), whether restricted or not.

GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE - For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open, whether restricted or not.

MID-LIMIT - For dogs which have note become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT - For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN - For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION - Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the society.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at 9.00am.
- 2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3 Judging will commence at 10.00am.
- 4 Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5 The use of cooking stoves is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- 6 Entry Fees: See page 1. Entry fees once made are not returnable and cannot be refunded. Cheques to be made payable to 'Western Afghan Hound Club'. All payment must be in Sterling and drawn on a UK bank.
- 7 There will be no prize money at this show.
- 8 The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. The WAHC will accept NFC entries for puppies between the age of four to six months, with the proviso that owners accept full responsibility for their welfare.
- 10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 11 Best Puppy in Show: Where a Best Puppy In Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy, it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from other competition: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12 Best in Show: The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. Withdrawal from other competition: The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

Proviso For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
