



Criteria for the compilation of

Judges Lists

which are compiled in accordance with recommendations by The Kennel Club Judges Education Party. The list is finalised only by the complete agreement of the Committee of the Western Afghan Hound Club and requirements met do not necessarily guarantee inclusion onto the list.

A1 List

For persons who have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed and have the support of the WAHC.

A2 List

For persons who fulfil all the requirements of the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and are accepted by The Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 List and have the support of the WAHC.

A3 List (Breed Specialists)

For persons who WAHC would support to judge the Breed and who fulfil all the requirements listed but who have not yet been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and who have not yet been accepted for inclusion on an A2 list.

Requirements

- 1 To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed (Afghans) and have the support of the Club.
- 2 To have judged at an Afghan Hound breed club open show or a 10 class or larger breed club supported Afghan Hound open show.
3. To have judged a minimum of 100 dogs of the breed (Afghans).

4. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs, which have obtained entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book. In the case of owned dogs, they must have been in the ownership of the applicant when they first obtained Stud Book entry.

5. To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC Regulations and Judging Procedures.

6. To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.

7. To have attended and passed a Hands-on Assessment delivered by a KC Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.

8. To have passed an Exam for Breed judges organised by an Afghan Hound Breed Club or to have passed the Kennel Club's Breed Competency Assessment.

9. To have stewarded over a minimum of 12 days at either open or championship shows.

A3 List (Non Specialists)

Requirements

- 1 To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed (Afghans) and have the support of the Club.

2 To have judged at an Afghan Hound breed club open show or a 10 class or larger breed club supported Afghan Hound open show.

3. To have judged a minimum of 100 dogs of the breed (Afghans).

4. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs, which have obtained entry in The Kennel Club Stud Book. In the case of owned dogs, they must have been in the ownership of the applicant when they first obtained Stud Book entry.

5. To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC Regulations and Judging Procedures.

6. To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.

7. To have attended and passed a Hands-on Assessment delivered by a KC Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement.

8. To have passed an Exam for Breed judges organised by an Afghan Hound Breed Club or to have passed the Kennel Club's Breed Competency Assessment.

9. To have stewarded over a minimum of 12 days at either open or championship shows.

10. To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed.

B List (Breed Specialists)

(Supported by the WAHC for judging at all levels any number of classes **without certificates**).

Requirements

1 To have 5 years' experience owning and exhibiting in the breed and have the support of the Club.

2. To have judged a minimum of 30 dogs of the breed (Afghans).

3. To have attended at least one Breed Specific Seminar/BAD day and had hands-on training.

4. To have passed a Breed Specific Exam for judges organised by an Afghan Breed Club or passed the Multiple-Choice Exam.

5. To have stewarded any breed over a minimum period of two full days at any show.

B List (Non Specialists)

(Supported by the WAHC for judging at all levels any number of classes **without certificates**).

Requirements

1 To have a minimum 5 years' experience in any one breed and have the support of the Club.

2. To have judged a minimum of 30 dogs of the breed (Afghans).

3. To have attended at least one Breed Specific Seminar/BAD day and had hands-on training.

4. To have passed a Breed Specific Exam for judges organised by an Afghan Breed Club or passed the Multiple-Choice Exam.

5. To have stewarded any breed over a minimum period of two full days at any show.

C List (Supported by the WAHC for judging up to 3 Afghan classes at Open Shows).

Requirements

For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the Western Afghan Hound Club.

ALL applicants must provide copies of relevant certificates as appropriate to be considered for inclusion.
