Its 25 founder members formed the organisation of the Club and the application was sponsored by Mrs Charles Harrison (Vishnu) and Mr Albert Munroe from the Southern Afghan Club. The original application had three possible names but the first choice was approved by the Kennel Club and it was to become known as the Western Afghan Hound Club.

The first President was the late Mrs Wyn Leest (Chitral), the first Secretary was Mrs Linda Hammerberg and the first Treasurer, Mr Vincent Gwilym. The original committee comprised 15 members.

Mike Lancashire together with his wife, Avril, formed the Drishaun Kennel in 1984 and since that time they have had much success with dogs either in ownership or bred by them under this affix, culminating in many Champions from the original foundation dogs, notably Ch Moonswift Moonglade.

During the late '90's the kennel made history by becoming the first in the UK to produce a litter from artificial insemination using frozen semen from the USA. Three from that litter

ultimately became Champions - Ch Drishaun That'll Do Icely - Ch Drishaun Icely Does It - Ch Drishaun Ice If You C'n Get It.

Eight years ago Drishaun imported a brother and sister duo from the Gazon kennel in the USA, both of these became Champions, and offspring are currently being shown from a litter born from Ch Gazon It Ain't About You Drishaun and sired by Ch Shimalma Colour of Magic.

Mike has judged the breed 11 times at CC level in the UK, the last appointment being the bitch classes at Crufts in 2012. He has also judged the breed in America, South Africa and Germany.

He is Vice-Chairman of the Afghan Hound Breed Council, and Vice-Chairman of the Yorkshire Afghan Hound Society.



I began my association with Afghan Hounds in 1962 and registered my IZMAR prefix with the Kennel Club during the early sixties. My first Champion was a red Carloway/ Horningsea bitch, Ch. Miyasht Empress, a truly beautiful bitch. The union between her and Father Ford and Helen Barnes' Ch. Hajuba of Davlen produced my first home bred Champion, and then put to Ch. Alyshan Hassan Shabbah she produced my second. Many successful litters followed with these lines.

In 1986, John Watson, Andrew Brace and myself imported Ch. Mandrills Myltha Izmar Tragband from Finland, a bitch in whelp to Int. Ch. Choice Be A Pepper. Myltha went on to gain her English title and was a Group winner. The quarantine litter produced one of the top stud dogs at that time, winning Top Afghan Hound Stud Dog and Top Hound Stud Dog - Ch. Izmar Tragband Finnegan - the sire of many Champions and top winning Afghan Hounds.

I also owned his sister, Ch. Izmar Finnishing School in partnership with Sarah Jackson, and we thought it would be ideal to import Boxadan Give Me a Break at Benatone as his lines would marry well with those of Finnegan's offspring, which proved to be the case. Give Me a Break soon gained his English title.

John Watson and I then purchased a bitch from Ireland, Tejas Coquistador (Riot) - together with Finnegan she produced Champions of a lovely type. Later co-owned by me and shown and co-owned by Mike Gadsby she went on to be a Multi CC, Group and Crufts' Best in Show winning bitch.

I have judged the breed at CC level on twenty one occasions in the UK, including Crufts in 1988, and in Finland, Germany, Canada and Australia. I consider it a privilege to judge the prestigious Western AHC and hope to see you there.



It was an honour to be asked to write about my dogs for the Western Afghan Hound club's 50th anniversary show, particularly as this has always been one of my favourite shows.

osh where to start, my memory not being as good as it used to be, although I never forget any of the lovely dogs I have owned, it's the order of events that may be a little shady.

My love for the Afghan Hound started after seeing a puppy while on holiday in USA in 1974, after a 6 week holiday my most memorable and most talked about moment was this wonderful intriguing dog I had seen and wanted.

That same year in November I was given the best Christmas present any one could have asked for, but little did my parents know how much of a lasting impact they had made on my life.

Bronze "Cassanorr Shebaniah" was the love of my life (until Brian) and with the help of some lovely people, Joyce Fagg and Barbra Londos who became my early mentors, Bronze my first show dog had a successful show career until a freak accident at 19 months when he broke his leg.

Brian and I married in 1978 We had two lovely daughters, along with 2 pretty Afghan bitches Tia and Chamey

The Gentle Touch of Tianze "Abby" was purchased from Steve Moon in 1982 and became my foundation bitch, she was by Ch Balkasha Barabbas and Khonistan Khikidi of Tashmahn. Her first litter was sired by Ch Barnesmore Imperial Wizard and produced my first home bred Champion "Oliver" Ch Tianze Kalvados. Abby's second litter was sired by Ch Shullimar Rainbow Warrior and from this I kept "Lizzy" Tianze Total Eclipse and "Merlin" Tianze Skys The Limit. Lizzy produced a litter by Khinjan Ko Ko (Oliver's son) and a



daughter from this litter "Wispa" Tianze Night Shade, came with us to Australia and later gained her Aus Ch title.

I purchased Omayyak Taboo "Ziggy" from Jim Lacey. She was mated to Oliver producing my second home bred Ch "Ruth" Ch Tianze Bewitched.

"Delbert" Harlextan Mad Mullah, joined us about 6 months after Ruth was born, he was purchased to compliment my breeding program as a nice outcross.

Delbert had a phenomenal show and stud career in England and gained his English title with ease and went on to become my first Australian Champion at 9 years young, winning several groups on the way. He retired after winning

best veteran in show at the prestigious Queensland Hound Show 20th July 1997 Engh Espen (Norway). Thanks to Graham and Christine Parsell we collected semen from Delbert that year and 20 years later there was to be another Delbert litter.

Ziggy had a second litter this time by Delbert, producing a singleton pup, "Joannie" Tianze Lonely Girl, who was the dam of my first Australian litter, sired by Oliver. Probably not the most successful litter, the boy I kept didn't really like showing and was way, way too English for over here at that time. He retired and spent a lovely life as Daphne Gie's companion, Tianze The Amber Nectar aka Foster.



More success was to come from my next Australian litter, Delbert to Olivia in 1998 Two puppies were kept from this litter, "Fletcher" Aus Ch Tianze Wild Orchid and "Chelsie" Aus Ch Tianze English Rose, both doing fairly well and gained their titles. Chelsie was mated but we were devastated to lose her in whelp with a brain aneurysm.

Olivia produced 2 more lovely litters, one to my Ch Calahorra Anthem which produced 3 pups. I kept a brindle boy Ch Tianze Dare to Dream "Sydney". The 3rd litter to a very handsome Aussy dog, "Beau" Ch Keywest in Like Flynn and I kept a boy and named him "James" Ch Tianze Heza Kinda Magic.

2002, an addition to the kennel was our much loved brindle girl "Charlie" BIS, SBIS Grand Ch Karakush U Giv Me Reason, She was an absolute show pony and won multiple BIS and groups awards.

Struggling to find the right dog to compliment my bitches, my interest in the breed was fading. Until I set eyes on a stunning male dog who came down to Queensland for some shows. This was Joss Aus Grand Ch Lakshmis High Command (imp Den) We eventually had puppies with "Molly" Ch Tianze The Power of One, (Molly was the only puppy from Khinjan Ko Ko and Joannie). This litter was the start of big things to come, "Jade" Ch Tianze Power of Illusion and "Magik" my heart dog, Grand Ch Tianze Power of Magik. Multi Best in Show, Specialty Best in Show and multi Group winner. Just coming in to his prime winning Best in Show at the Qld Afghan Specialty under Chris Amoo and a couple of months later Runner up Best in Show at Canberra Afghan





Specialty from Glenda Adams. This dog was to break my heart; losing him at the tender age of 6 to a paralysis tick and an incompetent vet. I don't think I will ever get over his loss.


Fortunately, his legacy goes on, Magik sired two litters about 6 months before he died, the first to "Sophie" Aus Ch Quidam Cirque of Jhanzi (Imp NZ), from this litter of 13 there were 8 Champions all of them Group winners. Ch Tianze Morgan Le Fae, a Specialty Best in Show winner, Ch Tianze Bewitch Me, Ch Tianze Copper Field, Ch Tianze Hi Jinx, "Victoria" Ch Tianze Mystical Mayhem, "Edward" CH Tianze Wicked Wizard, "Zam" BIS, Supreme Ch Tianze Shazzam,


and "Jacob" BIS. Supreme Ch Field Ch Tianze Mystify Me. Iacob, Edward and Victoria are owned by me and Zam was very successfully shown in North Queensland but had to come home as his owner could no longer show him. He was so close to his Supreme title, it would have been

a shame not to have achieved it, in a very short time with me, Zam gained the couple of hundred points and 3 groups he needed to become a Supreme Ch.

To become an Australian Champion the dog has obtain 100 points. A Grand Ch 1000 points and for a Supreme Ch 1000 points and 10 Groups from 10 different Judges. Rules for Supreme Champion didn't come into place until 2012 Unfortunately neither Magik nor Charlie were eligible to be awarded the title as all their multiple groups and BIS wins were before this qualifying date.

Jacob has a very busy social life, probably my biggest winning dog, a Supreme Ch 3 times over with 40 odd

groups, Multi Best in Shows and Runner up in Shows. He was the first ever Sight Hound in Australia to gain a Field Ch in Lure Coursing, under FCI regulations. He has been a cat walk model for a big hair product company and most recently has been starring in a Netflix comedy movie due to be released this year. Fingers crossed that later this year he will also sire his first litter.

Delbert and Jade's daughter, Delta, produced a lovely litter to Karakush Jose Cuervo. Again, this litter did extremely well with 5 Champions. My two keepers, "Madison" Ch Tianze Shadow of the Past and "Wow" BIS Supreme Ch Tianze Lady of Rohan, the first Afghan to gain a Supreme title in Aust. Wow was and still is the most beautiful bitch, outstanding movement which gave me goose bumps to watch. Sadly, I decided never to breed on with ether of the girls, after losing their father with a progressive and hereditary tumour. They turn 10 in July this year.

Magik's second litter was a litter we planned with Charlie, but had significant problems achieving. I had attempted to mate Charlie on about 6 different occasions with no results. Many tests were run and eventually my vet said "give up, she's barren". But Charlie had different ideas, the love of her life was Magik and she wanted him, so at 8 years old, she helped herself, I didn't think

much of it, but as the weeks went by I started to think? Well is she. Yes, she was! 9 puppies and only a week apart from Sophie. Two litters together gave me 22 pups, Heaven and Hell, fun and chaos at the same time LOL. not something I would recommend, but I did love every minute.

From Charlie, we had

"Pickle" Ch Tianze A Little Bita Magik very different to anything I have owned, only just reaching the standard as she was a very sickly puppy and I thought I would lose her on several occasions. I hadn't intended to show her but she would be staying as she was so special. A lovely young lady, Cath Horne fell in love with her and although I would never sell Pickle, Cath co owned her and campaigned her to her title with some nice wins including a Specialty bitch CC with Runner up in Show under Jeff Bunney. 2 other dogs from this litter were successfully shown and titled.

December 2014, the one remaining straw from Delbert, was used on Victoria. A very exciting time having Delbert children with 18 year old semen. Producing 9 beautiful babies. A special lady in the UK had been waiting 3 years for a little gold girl and although I would dearly have loved to keep her a promise is a promise so Tianze Melt my Heart to Normarand, with her two sisters made the long journey to England. Marj Barber named her "Sydney", Mary and Chris Pascoe call their girl "Crystal" Tianze Ice Crystal at Sarakhan and "Queenie" Tianze Ice Queen with her mum Chris Bagshaw. It was lovely to catch up with two of them this year and looking forward to what the future brings for them. My own girl "Elsa" Ch Tianze Frozen in Time was titled at the tender age of 1 year 2 weeks and Bear's boy "Drum" Ch Tianze Ice Breaker gained his title with ease.

Bringing you up to date Easter Monday 2017 the second litter from Victoria was born to the stunning all black boy Supreme Ch Aviva Akira. 4 all black babies 2 girls, 2 boys, all in show homes and all have points towards their titles "EB" Tianze No Doubt About It, "Bunny" Tianze Started with A Kiss, "Jessica"

Tianze I Believe in Miracles, and "Louie" Tianze Black as The Night

I have bred and owned 19 Aust Champions, four achieving the title of Grand Champion and 3 gaining their Supreme title, and 2 English Champions

Owned and Titled 6 from other Kennels. UK and Aus Ch Harlextan Mad Mullah (Imp UK). Grand Ch Karakush U Giv Me Reason. Ch Calahorra Anthem. Aus & NZ Ch Vizier Hafiz of Jhanzi (Imp NZ). Ch Quidam Cirgue Of Jhanzi (Imp NZ).

My latest little girl "Ava" Ch Calahorra Ava Gardner, she has just turned 2 years old and over 1/4 of the way to her Grand title, recently wining a nice bitch Challenge at the Queensland Afghan Hound Specialty. She is a great granddaughter of Magik and Edward's Grand Daughter.

I have also owned and titled an Irish Water Spaniel, Ch Craythorn Rambling Rose.

A Lhasa Apso, now 14 and the top wining bitch in Qld. for 3 years, the first Lhasa to gain her Supreme title. Supreme Ch Myikiyi Simplee Betta. 2 Grand Basset Griffon Vendeen's, Supreme Champion Rickaby Bound for Glory CA and Ch Rickaby Dear to Dream, I am currently waiting for a mating between these two.

I hope you have enjoyed reading my story.

All the best wishes to the Western Afghan on this special day. I wish I could be there to join in the celebrations. Good luck and love from me.

BRITISH NEWSPAPER ARCHIVES 1890-1899

DOVER EXPRESS, 18th September 1891 THE LATE MR JAMRACH

"With the death of Mr Charles Jamrach, a notable character has disappeared (says a writer in the Standard). He was a London merchant, and the commodities in which he dealt were wild beasts. Here a tiger might be purchased with no more words than need be expended over the sale of a horse, and an elephant bought as readily as a pair of pigeons in the Seven Dials ...

A MEETING PLACE FOR ALL SORTS AND CONDITIONS OF MEN Mr Jamrach's establishment was, no doubt, one of the sights of London. But after seeing his beasts and birds, his creeping things and his crawling

things, and after listening to his professional talk, the visitor left in doubt whether there was any curiosity in his place to equal Mr Jamrach himself. Certainly to those who like to study their species, the men who came to sell and the customers who came to buy were quite as entertaining as the articles in which they dealt.

..... As a speciality the great wild-beast dealer – and in England, at least, *Mr* Cross, of Liverpool, was his only rival – laid himself out for such comparatively harmless stock as long-coated Persian greyhounds [Afghan Hounds most probably], Japanese pugs, and Madagascar cats, and for the more professional section of his customers there was also a good "line" in lions and tigers, dwarf cattle from Burma, and boa-constrictors from South America.

SHIELDS DAILY NEWS, 10th November 1892 NOTES FROM THE FIELD - AN AFRICAN GREYHOUND

"When in India I saw imported Arab greyhounds. They were small, tan-coloured, and had curious tufts in their ears. I also saw some Persian greyhounds, belonging to Mr Stannard, of Kirkee. They were very large dogs, with very little hair, and very fierce. Mr Stannard had also an Afghan greyhound, called Bill. He was yellow, and said to be a wonderfully good sporting dog. I think these dogs were all much larger than English greyhounds. - Ethelbred Dillon.

NOTTINGHAM EVENING POST, 9th February 1893 METROPOLITAN NOTES [FROM LONDON CORRESPONDENTS]

"There were nearly 3,000 entries for the great Dog Show which was opened today at the Agricultural Hall, and generally speaking, the quality was very good. The Queen [Victoria] sent six dogs – a collie, a Skye terrier, and four Pomeranians. The Prince of Wales [future Edward VII] and his well-known team of rough-coated Basset Hounds, and the Princess of Wales [future Queen Alexandra], whose affection for dogs is well known, contributed a St. Bernard, an Afghan dog of unknown variety and breeding, and a smooth-coated Basset Hound.

SPORTING LIFE, 8th May 1895

SHOW OF PET AND FOREIGN DOGS AT THE AOUARIUM "In the class for any other foreign variety, Gazelle, an imported Afghan hound of light fawn colour, scored the award.

LONDON EVENING STANDARD, 9th May 1895 PET DOGS AT THE AQUARIUM

"The annual exhibition of pet and foreign dogs under the auspices of the Toy Spaniel, Pug Dog, Schipperke, Pomeranian and Poodle Clubs, was opened at the Aquarium on Tuesday, and will continue open during to-day. All the best-known exhibitors are represented. The exhibits number some 550 dogs (the entries being nearly 1000), so that the Show is on a larger scale than that of last year A unique canine curiosity is "The Squidgs", a dog distinguished by an artificial leg, the limb having been lost as the result of an accident Some very fine specimens of foreign dogs are included, ranging from creatures no bigger than a rat to Esquimaux dogs and Afghan hounds.

GLOBE, 10th December 1895 FOREIGN DOGS AT THE AQUARIUM

"Another animal well worth seeing is the graceful Afghan Barukhzy hound which seems like a mixture of the Borzois, the greyhound, and the water spaniel. It has long silky hair covering it's legs trouser fashion.

LONDON STANDARD, 11th December 1895 FOREIGN DOGS AT THE AQUARIUM

"An interesting Show of Chow Chows, Schipperkes, and other varieties of foreign dogs has been arranged at the Royal Aquarium by Clubs especially interested in these breeds.

Other breeds on view are, and the Barukhzy hound, employed in hunting the gazelle. Mr J Whitbread's Shazada, which belongs to this last class, is a beautiful animal with long silken hair, and a face that reminds one of pictures by Sir Edward Landseer."

PALL MALL GAZETTE, 11th December 1895 GARGOYLE DOGS AT THE AOUARIUM. SOME GROTESOUE EXHIBITS

"; and there is a thing called an Afghan Barukhzy hound, a long-legged, gaunt ghost from the bare hills that moans like a lost soul, and has the appearance of wearing tights all over its body, except on its hind legs, where it has a thick even coat of straight hair, which gives it the look of having been endowed with trousers according to the requirements of the licensing committee of the late County Council.

MORNING POST (London), 12th December 1895 FOREIGN DOGS AT THE AQUARIUM

[A joint show of various breed clubs with a class for "miscellaneous foreign varieties entered."]

"An Afghan hound with Borzoi-like head and legs clothed to the toes with long silky hair aroused much interest"

PALL MALL GAZETTE, 9th April 1896 INDIAN NOTES

"A new cure for hydrophobia has been discovered by the Boundary Commission under Captain MacMahon, which is now delineating the frontiers of Baluchistan and Afghanistan. The only danger encountered by the mission so far has been the raiding of the camp by rabid Afghan hounds, creatures in appearance as well as character half way between the wolf and the greyhound. When they are mad, however, they are all wolf; and several of the native troopers of the escort have been badly bitten. According to the natives, rabies and hydrophobia are very common in that frontier region, and the only certain cure for the latter is worship, with certain special observances; in the shrine of Said-Yahya, after which the patient must eat a mouthful of earth from the sacred spot.

CHESHIRE OBSERVER, 15th August 1896 SIR JAMES BROWNE AND HIS DOUBLE

" I went out walking one afternoon with the late Colonel Fellowes of the 32nd Pioneers (writes Sir James Browne). Just outside the Quetta Fort we saw a man in Afghan costume, and sitting on the ground, who at once attracted our attention. He wore a white sleeveless Bedfordcord waistcoat, and a very worn pair of Afghan-made shoes, and a big Persian greyhound [Afghan Hound probably] was lying by him. Round his neck, and in a curiously-stamped red-leather case, was hung a large book, presumably the Koran; but his brown beard and blue eves, and the indescribable difference of bearing which distinguishes a European from an Asiatic, at once made me say to Colonel Fellowes, "That man looks uncommonly like a European [they thought he might be a Russian] *spy*], and he does not sit on his heels as a native would." Colonel *Fellowes replied "Not only does he look like a European, but he is the* very image of you - so much so, that if you were dressed like him it would be impossible to distinguish you." He said he was a Kirghiz, and was going to Mecca on pilgrimage, having just come from Kandahar." [Maybe the dog was for security and/or company?]

LONDON DAILY NEWS, 20th October 1897 DOGS AT THE CRYSTAL PALACE

"The Kennel Club's forty-second exhibition of sporting and other dogs ... Next to these [Samoyeds], to the general public, interest perhaps centred in the fine collection of foreign dogs, among these being specimens of the Esquimaux, the Norwegian Elkhound, the Dogue de Bordeaux, the Dingo, and last but not least in point of attractiveness, the Afghan Barukhzy hound

YORKSHIRE POST & LEEDS INTELLIGENCER, 3rd May 1899 [Pet Dog Show at the Westminster Aquarium]

"The foreign dogs included several Esquimaux dogs, a wild Australian dingo, an Afghan hound, and a Pyrenean wolf hound. But they were not in much strength, and the bulk of them were more curious than beautiful."




